ALBANY, GEORGIA

A meeting of the Albany Movement was held the night of February 17, 1964, at the Arcadia Baptist Church. Approximately 125 persons attended.

CHARLES SHERROD, Field Secretary for Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, encouraged the group to increase voter registration activities in the Albany, Georgia, area.

**7C**  
[REDACTED] expressed a desire to lead a demonstration in the Albany, Georgia, area on February 22, 1964. No plans were formulated for a demonstration.

SLATER KING, Acting President of the Albany Movement, addressed the group denouncing the death of DONNIE C. ASBERY, (phonetic), described as a Negro killed by Albany, Georgia, police officers on the night of February 15, 1964, during a fight. He stated Albany, Georgia, police officers were responsible for five "needless murders" during the past year. He encouraged Negroes in the Albany area to arm themselves with guns and ammunition "to keep police from entering residences and killing."

No arrests or incidents were reported.




NOTE: Department previously advised unconfirmed report received indicating demonstrations might take place in Albany on 2/22/64. As a result of inquiries made by Atlanta in this matter, it was determined that sources at Albany advised that leaders of the Albany movement are interested in massing some sort of demonstration on 2/22/64; however, no concrete plans have yet been made. On 2/20/64 Departmental Attorney Jerome Heilbron requested the above coverage. It is noted that Albany, Georgia, has been the scene of numerous racial incidents in the past two years.

"COMMISSARS IN THE U. S. A.

"An attempt to create a commissar system in the American armed forces and to make civilian communities in the U.S. subject to the political orders of military base commanders has been proposed in the infamous Gesell Report issued this summer.

"The full title of the 93-page report is 'Equality of Treatment and Opportunity for Negro Military Personnel Stationed Within the United States.' This is a mild-sounding title, but the actual document contains a body-blow at freedom of thought and action in this country.

"Here are some of the recommendations made in the Gesell Report:

"Base commanders should appoint bi-racial committees in the communities to break down racial separation.

"Civic clubs should not be joined by military personnel if they are not integrated.

"Methods are suggested for getting around local segregated housing by leasing homes in the name of the government and moving Negroes in.

"Promotion of officers should be based on their 'initiative' and 'accomplishments' in forcing integration.

"Military personnel should be allowed to patronize only those establishments that are integrated.

"Girls who believe in segregation are not to be allowed on bases for social functions.

"Negro hostesses should be considered at base functions instead of white.

"Military promotion boards should not be allowed to view photographs of officers under consideration.

"A base snooper should be appointed to whom those with complaints are encouraged to make anonymous charges of discrimination.

"Base commanders are to be held personally responsible for promoting integration on base and off base.

"The recommendations are so outrageous - so much in violation of law and custom in this country - that one can hardly believe they are serious. But they are to be taken seriously. It is the clear aim of the Kennedy administration to use the military bases, to force radical social change in this country. As in the communist armies, political commissars are to ride herd on officers and men alike and to guide nearby civilian communities.

The Gesell Report makes plain that is it not enough for an officer to be a skilled military professional; he must hold the political opinions of the administration. This isn't America, however; it is the kind of set-up one finds in the Red Army.

"The Gesell Report should open the eyes of millions of Americans to the kind of radical reconstruction of the United States that the Kennedy administration seeks. It aims to get its way by a combination of military and economic pressure. If a community adjacent to a base refuses to come to heel, the administration intends to declare the area off-limits.

"Who are the people who were appointed by President Kennedy to this committee? Gerhard Gesell, whose name the report bears, is a Washington lawyer. Congressman Helbert of Louisiana has reported that Mr. Gesell in effect only loaned his name to the committee and that the report actually was drafted by N.S. ~~Cdley~~, an official of the NAACP in California. Other members chosen by Mr. Kennedy to make recommendations for U.S. armed forces include ~~Abe Fortas~~, a liberal wheelhorse and former adviser to the U.S. delegation to the U.N. meeting in San Francisco in 1945; Benjamin ~~Muse~~, ultra-liberal writer from ~~Virginia~~ and foe of conservative government in that state; John H. ~~Sengstacke~~, an official of the Hampton Institute, a Negro college; and Whitney M. ~~Young~~, director of the Urban League, who went on record as saying that Negroes should receive preferential treatment.

"The Gesell Report is a national shame. The armed forces of the United States exist to defend this country against its foreign enemies, and for no other reason. The Army, Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps certainly do not exist for the purpose of pushing the Kennedys' pet social theories or for helping the Kennedy administration win more Negro votes in the 1964 election.

"Congress should make it plain to the White House that a commissar system has no place in the defense establishment of the United States."

7C This pamphlet was left in the apartment of [redacted] Marine Corps Supply Center, Albany, Georgia, approximately March 29, 1964. [redacted] had a party in his residence on that evening. The identities of those attending are not known. He furnished this pamphlet to [redacted], Marine Corps Supply Center, Albany, Georgia, and would not give the identities of the people attending his party. The pamphlet was allegedly addressed to him and left at his residence. [redacted] furnished this pamphlet to [redacted] Second Missile Battalion, 43rd Artillery, Turner Air Force Base, Albany, Georgia on April 6, 1964. [redacted] in turn furnished this pamphlet to [redacted].

[redacted] advised that [redacted] has been active in forming the Bi-Racial Committee in the Albany, Georgia area.

A meeting of the Albany Movement was held the night of April 20, 1964, at the Shiloh Baptist Church, Albany, Georgia. Approximately 400 persons attended.

~~SLATER KING~~, President of the Albany Movement, spoke and protested the killing by gunshot of a 15-year-old Negro male by an officer of the Albany, Georgia, Police Department during the early morning hours of April 19, 1964, at the scene of a burglary. He stated C. B. KING, Attorney for the Albany Movement, would attend the inquest.

KING requested persons attending this meeting to appear at a meeting of the City Commission at City Hall the night of April 21, 1964, for the purpose of protesting the killing of Negroes by Albany police officers.

On the evening of April 21, 1964, approximately 50 Negroes appeared at City Hall, Albany, Georgia, to attend a meeting of the City Commission. The scheduled meeting of this commission had been postponed earlier, and the Negroes left without incident.

A meeting of the Albany Movement was held the night of June 29, 1964, at the Shiloh Baptist Church, Albany, Georgia. Approximately 300 persons attended.

SLATER KING, President of the Albany Movement, addressed the group, pointing out Albany's need for Negro-owned businesses. He encouraged boycott of businesses owned by white merchants in the Albany area.

SAMUEL BENJAMIN WELLS discussed his recent visit to Saint Augustine, Florida, and described the progress made toward integration of that city.

CHEVENE B. KING, Attorney and candidate for Congress, encouraged continued voter registration efforts and requested financial support for his campaign for Congress.

No comments were made concerning any activity to test the provisions of the current Civil Rights Bill after it becomes law.

7C A white male described as being young and introduced [redacted] attended the meeting and stated he was in Albany, Georgia, to aid in the voter registration program.

No incidents were reported.

RACIAL SITUATION, ALBANY, GEORGIA

[REDACTED] advised on July 6, 1964, that at 4:15 p.m. on July 5, 1964, ten adults and three juveniles, all Negro males, were arrested for loitering by the Albany Police Department at the Tift Park swimming pool area, Albany. [REDACTED] stated that the arrests were made based on the complaint of James Gray, Jr., manager of the swimming pool. According to [REDACTED] the Negroes attempted to purchase tickets to the swimming pool and were refused by Gray. Gray requested the Negroes to leave and they refused to do so.

[REDACTED] stated that the Tift Park swimming pool was purchased by James Gray, Sr., sometime ago from the City of Albany and the pool is a private pool.

[REDACTED] stated that the individuals arrested are presently confined in the Albany City Jail and their cases will be disposed of on July 9, 1964, at the Albany City Court. A \$102.00 bond was set against each of the individuals arrested.


