In the June number of the Liberator appears an advertisement of a publication known as "The Messenger", which is described as the "Only Radical Regro Magazine in America". It is edited by Chandler Owen and A. Philip Randolph, publisher, hessenger Publishing Co., 2505 Seventh Avenue, New York City. In the advertisement, it is commended by H. W. L. Dana, formerly of Columbia University, and Roger H. Baldwin, some of whose articles I have seen in I. W. W. publications. I recommend that copies of this paper be secured and that it be kept under observation, as it is undoubtedly an attempt to stir up trouble smong the negroes.

On the back of the Liberator spears an advertisement of "Revel" a novel by Harold Lord Varney, which is described as a romance of the I. W. W. and Bolaheviki. The price, \$8.00, indicates that it will be read more extensively by the parlor Solsheviki sthan by the "Proleteriat". It is published by Irving Kaye Davis & Co., 42 Neet 28th St., New York City. It is supposed to be out June 1. I recomment that a popy be secured.

This number of the Liberator also contains advertisements of the Revolutionary age and books by Louis C. Frains, showing that the Liberator sides with the Left Wing devement. The Revolutionary age is trying to be designated as the official organ of the Left Wing.
