June 7, 1963

Demonstrations for period June 1 thru 6

CALIFORNIA, Oakland

Freedom rally sponsored by the NAACP held on 5/31/63, "in observation of the Emancipation Proclamation Centennial." Attendance 3,000. Funds for Southern Victims.

CALIFORNIA, Sacramento

20 persons slept for the second night in the rotunda of the capitol. Re: Housing bill.

CALIFORNIA, San Jose

On 6/1/63 - 1000 demonstrators staged quiet march in downtown San Jose, protesting discrimination.

FLORIDA, Daytona Beach

On 6/6/63 - 100 Negroes demonstrated at lunch counter. The protest, by high school students was the seventh demonstration in the last week. Later they picketed theaters and two cafeterias.

FLORIDA, Gainesville

One man was shot, two white men were beaten and their car smashed by a crowd of angry Negroes Sunday 6/2/63. Negroes tried to purchase tickets at theater. Crowds of Negroes grew to 1,000.

FLORIDA, Tallahassee

On 6/1/63 - Negro students demonstrate at two theaters.

FLORIDA, Winter Haven

Negroes returned to civic center where they had been chased away by a group of whites over the weekend - 6/2/63.

FLORIDA, Miami

Small groups of Negroes demonstrated in front of supermarkets and a discount store. Protesting hiring practices - 6/1/63.

GEORGIA, Savannah

On 6/4/63 - Negroes demonstrated at City Hall, protesting segregated theaters.

LOUISIANA, Baton Rouge

On 6/1/63 - Negroes demonstrated at variety store lunch counters. Re: biracial committee.

MARYLAND, Cambridge

Small group of pickets Thursday 6/6/63 walked in front of Recreation Center, then stood for a short while in front of jail.

MICHIGAN, St. Johns

On 5/30/63 - 50 Negroes picket resort.

MISSISSIPPI, Jackson

Demonstrations continue - Nine Negroes arrested 6/5/63, more than 600 have been arrested.

NEW JERSEY, Englewood

Over 100 demonstrators marched to the school on 6/3/63. No arrests. Desegregation of school requested. Picketed again on 6/4/63.

NORTH CAROLINA, Greensboro

About 200 Negroes demonstrated through downtown Greensboro on 6/2/63.

About 1200 Negroes demonstrated Thursday night 6/6/63 and marched to downtown section and sat in the middle of main intersection. About 300 arrested.

Jesse Jackson, head of student body of N.C. Agricultural and Technical College arrested for inciting a riot.

NORTH CAROLINA, Lexington

A white man was killed and another wounded Thursday night 6/6/63 during racial flareup. Shootings came after group of Negroes unsuccessfully sought service at several downtown establishments and a crowd of whites gathered.

OKLAHOMA, Oklahoma City

On 5/31/63 - Demonstrations at restaurants.

TENNESSEE, Chattanooga

On 6/5/63, Negroes were unsuccessful in their day of attempts to gain service at segregated restaurants.

TENNESSEE, Nashville

Student Non-violent Committee picketed stores here Monday 6/3/63. Unfair employment practices.

VIRGINIA, Danville

On 6/5/63 - 120 Negroes demonstrated at city hall. Have picketed since last Friday. Five persons Arrested. Re: Employment.

June 14, 1963

Demonstrations for period June 7 thru 13.

ALABAMA, Gadsden

300 Negro demonstrators marched here on 6/12/63 protesting arrest of women demonstrator.

CALIFORNIA, Los Angeles

On 6/7/63 CORE picketed the Beverly Hilton Hotel.

WASHINGTON, D.C.

On 6/14/63 demonstrations at White House, District building and Justice Department.

FLORIDA, Bradenton

Beach closed 6/8/63 after demonstration and whites milling around.

FLORIDA, Sarasota

Negroes picketed downtown theaters on 6/7/63.

FLORIDA, Tallahassee

Negroes picketed theaters. Demonstrating for the last two weeks, 6/12/63.

Demonstration at State Office Building cafeteria on 6/7/63.

GEORGIA, Atlanta

Demonstrations at cafeteria Saturday 6/8/63. Fights started. 100 persons gathered to watch.

GEORGIA, Savannah

About 300 Negroes on 6/13/63 marched with placards into downtown area demanding for immediate desegregation. Shots fired at Negro home, no one was hit. Arrests in last 10 days passed the 500 mark. 3000 demonstrated on 6/12/63.

MARYLAND, Cambridge

More than 300 shouting white persons demonstrated. Both Negroes and whites marched, 6/13/63. Mayor has asked Gov. Tawes to declare martial law, 6/14/63.

MARYLAND, Ocean City

On 6/9/63 members of CORE conducted sit-in here. Re: restaurants.

MISSISSIPPI, Jackson Demonstrations continue after shooting of Medgar Evers. Police arrested 90 persons on 6/13/63.

MISSOURI, St. Louis 30 Negro parents blocked transportation, demonstrations re: schools. 6/7/63.

NEW JERSEY, Rahway Some 700 prisoners at the Rahway, N.J., prison farm reported on sick call in what officials declared was a demonstration stemming from racial tensions. 6/10/63.

NEW YORK, Biracial demonstrators protesting alleged job discrimination fought with police 6/13/63 at the construction of Harlem Hospital.

NORTH CAROLINA, Greensboro More than 1000 Negroes demonstrated Friday night 6/7/63, conducted a street "sit-in". Demanded desegregation.

NORTH CAROLINA, Lexington Mayor declared state of emergency Friday 6/7/63 as 500 whites battled about 50 Negroes who have been demonstrating.

OHIO, Columbus Demonstrations at State Legislature for fair housing bill on 6/13/63.

RHODE ISLAND, Providence 250 Negroes and whites jammed House Galleries 6/13/63 demonstrating for fair housing bill.

SOUTH CAROLINA, Beaufort 100 Negro demonstrators were arrested while attempting to get service at restaurant. More than 300 have been arrested in week-long drive 6/10/63.

SOUTH CAROLINA, Charleston Thirty three Negroes were arrested on 6/13/63 for trespassing after seeking services at a hotel and drug store lunch counter.

TENNESSEE, Nashville Police arrested 12 demonstrators at grocery store, demonstrating for jobs. 6/7/63.

TEXAS, Texarkansas

200 demonstrated against desegregation of Texarkana Junior College, paraded into the downtown district. No arrests.

VIRGINIA, Danville

More than 250 Negro demonstrators jammed into the Municipal Building steps 6/13/63 and requested some to hear desegregation demands. Demonstrations occurred for past two weeks.

Kansas, Topeka
Crowd of 400 persons demonstrated on the steps of Capitol Sunday 6/16/63 in memory of Medgar Evers.

Kansas, Wichita
350 to 400 mostly Negroes demonstrated at Courthouse 6/16/63 protesting against the killing of Medgar Evers.

Louisiana, Baton Rouge
Police Late Friday night dispersed unruly groups gathering in Negro sections here. Violence occurred. 6/14/63. On 6/18/63 demonstrated for Medgar Evers.

Maryland, Cambridge
Rally held by Negroes on 6/17/63, planning next demonstration. About 300 attended.

Massachusetts, Boston
Negroes protesting alleged school segregation boycotted 32 public schools. Estimated 3000 pupils stayed out, on 6/18/63.

Michigan, Detroit
Young Negroes attack and stabbed white man for "Mississippi" and "Alabama." 6/15/63

Mississippi, Clarksdale
Negroes demonstrated in front of two white churches on Sunday 6/16/63. Leaders said there will be other demonstrations.

Mississippi, Jackson
Negroes demonstrated Friday 6/16/63. Arrests were made.

Missouri, St. Louis
2000 Negroes demonstrated in downtown area, protesting alleged resegregation in the city school system, Thursday night 6/20/63. Demonstrations occurred during the week also.

New Jersey, Atlantic City
Pickets demonstration at American Medical Association convention here 6/19/63. demanding strong stand against segregation in medicine and health services.

New Jersey, Englewood
Negroes protesting sergregation in schools -sit-in class rooms 6/18/63 No school credit will be given demonstrators.

New Jersey, Fair Lawn

Members of CORE completed Sunday 6/16/63 the second weekend of picketing at the Fair Lawn Beach Club.

New Jersey, Newark

About 2000 persons at a City Hall rally Sunday 6/16/63 gathered to protest discrimination and mourn the death of Medgar Evers.

New Jersey, Orange

The Orange and Maplewood branch of the NAACP resumed picketing the local board of Education offices Monday 6/17/63. About 100 demonstrated in shifts.

New York

A sit-in demonstration in the offices of the State Commission for Human Rights, continued for the third day 6/20/63. Re: schools.

New York, Harlem

27 persons were arraigned on disorderly conduct and other charges here 6/18/63. Violence occurred after many groups joined fight against police.

North Carolina, Fayetteville

Demonstrations held here Friday night 6/14/63, and 140 persons were arrested. Tear gas used to disperse the crowd.

North Carolina, Kinston

Demonstrations here Thursday and Friday. Arrests totaled 382.

North Carolina, Monroe

25 pickets paraded around courthouse protesting segregation policies.

North Carolina, Oxford

Racial tensions flared here last weekend. Rock and knife fights between Negroes and whites for two consecutive nights. Uneasy calm here Sunday 6/16/63.

Ohio, Columbus

Group staged a sit-in in Gov. James A. Rhodes' inner office 6/17/63, protesting for fair housing law.

Ohio, Cleveland

60 policemen moved to break up a crowd of 300 white people throwing rocks. White man shot by Negroes earlier.

Pennsylvania, Erie

About 200 persons mostly Negroes, march near city hall 6/19/63, in protest of city racial policies, and plead for fair housing ordinance.

Pennsylvania, Pittsburgh

Negro pickets marched around the new Federal building in protest against leaders called discriminatory employment patterns.

South Carolina, Charleston

200 Negroes demonstrating Friday were arrested at lunch counters and white hotel. 60 arrested Saturday picketing theaters. A group earlier paraded for Medgar Evers.

Tennessee, Maryville

28 persons arrested yesterday 6/20/63 at training camp for demonstrators sponsored by CORE.

Texas, San Antonio

Negroes picketed city hall for desegregation of privately owned business that served the public.

Virginia, Danville

29 Negroes broke a three day truce 6/19/63 marching downtown two by two. A total of 109 demonstrators have been arrested here. Demonstrations have occurred for sometime.

Virginia, Leesburg

Negroes picketed theater here Sunday night. No arrests.

Washington, Seattle

More than 700 people, many white, marched in peaceful protest against racial discrimination.

Demonstrations for period July 4 and 5

CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO

On 7/4/63 - A singing crowd of about 25 persons, mostly Negroes marched through downtown area. Greeted by Mayor Charles Dail at Civic Center, and told group he would seek sincere solutions to racial problems.

WASHINGTON, D. C.

On 7/4/63 - Some members of the American Nazi Party picketed rally for Senator Barry Goldwater.

FLORIDA, PALM BEACH

On 7/4/63 - NAACP members attempted to use the city beach at Phipps Park. Entry refused.

FLORIDA, ST. AUGUSTINE

On 7/5/63 - Picketing continued at McCrory's and Woolworth's stores. Also three drugstores which have segregated lunch counters.

GEORGIA, SAVANNAH

On 7/4/63 - About 200 to 300 Negroes attended a rally at the Thankful Baptist Church where Mr. Hosea J. Williams spoke.

At 11:00 p.m., 7/4/63, about 200 Negroes marched to the Chatham County Jail where another rally was held.

On 7/5/63 - At 11:00 p.m., nearly 1,000 Negroes marched from church rally to the Chatham County Jail. Afternoon of 7/5/63, whites picketed stores that integrated.

ILLINOIS, CHICAGO

On 7/4/63 - NAACP convention held open-air session at Grant Park. About 50,000 attended. Mayor Daley and Rev. James H. Jackson booed.

On 7/4/63 - Racial disturbance - 75 white youths and 25 Negro youths were involved in a fight Cause of fight undetermined.

July 6, 1963

Demonstrations for Period June 28 thru 30

CALIFORNIA, Los Angeles

On 6/29/63 a motorcade consisting of 175 cars averaging three individuals per car departed Wrigley Field en route to Don Wilson's Southwood Housing Project, Torrance, Calif. Motorcade sponsored by NAACP and the United Civil Rights Committee (UCRC). About 1,200 demonstrators appeared at the Housing Project and marched in, out and around the tract singing songs. Two hundred of Committee Against Integration and Intermarriage picketed in opposition. 19 whites arrested.

On 6/30/63 18 members of CORE and the NAACP picketed the sales office. In addition 40 spectators were observed picketing.

CONNECTICUT, Stamford

NAACP held a peaceful demonstration at City Hall on 6/30/63. About 500 to 600 participated to protest discrimination.

WASHINGTON, D.C.

Members of CORE picketed the Republican Branch office on Friday 6/28/63. Housing

Four members of the American Nazi Party (ANP) demonstrated 6/28/63, in Judiciary Square. A member spoke about the problems of Nazi in U.S.

FLORIDA, Ocala

On 6/29/63, small groups of Negroes appeared at lunch counters. Were refused.

FLORIDA, St. Augustine

Sporadic picketing continued at the McCrory's and F.W. Woolworth stores. Lunch counters at these two places remained closed, 6/28/63

On 6/29/63, picketing of Ten cent stores continued without incident.

GEORGIA, Albany

Five Negroes were refused admittance at the First Baptist Church on 6/30/63. Arrested when they refused to disperse.

GEORGIA, Columbus

On 6/28/63, several carloads of Negroes, parked in front of a white theater here, but made no attempt to enter the theater.

GEORGIA, Savannah

Approximately 800 Negroes held a rally at the Flamingo Recreational Center in Savannah, Ga., on 6/28/63.

A rally and cross burning sponsored by the Klans was held 6/29/63 here. 1200 persons were estimated as being in attendance.

A rally attended by 200 persons was held by the Cavalcade of White Americans at Forsyth Park here on 6/29/63. Speakers requested no violence, but urged white persons to register. There were some anti-Negro remarks. 25 whites remained in the park, but directed away by police.

ILLINOIS, Chicago

NAACP held a wade-in demonstration on 6/30/63 at Calumet Park Beach.

ILLINOIS, Evanston

On 6/29/63, 1,000 demonstrated in protest against what they called segregated housing and job discrimination in Evanston.

KANSAS, Kansas City

On 6/30/63, about 500 Negroes marched to the county courthouse steps. The demonstration was a memorial to Medgar Evers.

MICHIGAN, Grosse Pointe

About 500 to 600 persons participated in a parade and rally on 6/29/63.

MISSISSIPPI, Greenville

Eight juvenile Negroes, led by two Negro girls eighteen years of age were arrested on 6/29/63, after a crowd of white people assembled.

MISSISSIPPI, Tchula

A Negro of Tchula, Miss., was with a large crowd of Negroes during a disturbance in the Negro section of Tchula on 6/30/63. He was arrested by Town Marshal and shot and killed when he resisted arrest.

MISSOURI, St. Louis

About 500 Negroes attended rally sponsored by CORE on night of 6/30/63. Advocated total integration.

| PENNSYLVANIA, Reading | On 6/30/63 the NAACP with about 100 persons in attendance held meeting to collect funds for Medgar Evers scholarship fund. Anti-integration signs on Hertz truck cruised in downtown streets on 6/30/63. |
| SOUTH CAROLINA, Charleston | 50 to 60 Negroes demonstrated in downtown area on 6/28/63. Picketed Mayor's office and others. No arrests. |
| SOUTH CAROLINA, Charleston | On the evening of 6/29/63, about 800 Negroes paraded in the King Street area of Charleston, S.C. |
| SOUTH CAROLINA, Charleston | On 6/29/63, 150 to 200 Negro youths demonstrated outside the police station, blocking the streets. 3 persons arrested, Youth leader said car ran traffic light and struck one of the demonstrators. He said police did nothing to stop the car before it struck the victim. |
| SOUTH CAROLINA, Charleston | On the morning of 6/30/63, Negro youths staged kneel-in demonstrations at several churches. Later, at mass meeting, Actor Brock Peters addressed the group. |

VIRGINIA, Danville

On 6/28/63, a mass meeting, attended by about 75 persons, was held at the Bible Way Church here.

On 6/30/63, about 300 Negroes attended a meeting in the Shiloh Baptist Church.

VIRGINIA, Suffolk

On 6/28/63, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King spoke before an orderly rally of about 5,000 persons, predominantly Negro, for about 20 minutes.

July 6, 1963

Demonstrations for Period July 1 thru 3.

FLORIDA, Panama City On 7/1/63, Negroes appeared at lunch counters of two drugstores and variety stores here. Lunch counters were closed.

FLORIDA, Panama City On 7/2/63, Negroes appeared at lunch counters at two drugstores. Stools already occupied by white persons who remained until Negroes departed.

FLORIDA, St. Augustine Picketing continued here on 7/1/63, at variety stores.

FLORIDA, St. Augustine Negroes picketed the Woolworth and McCrory stores on 7/3/63.

GEORGIA, Albany On 7/1/63 - Albany Movement held meeting. About 500 persons attended. Tighter boycott was stressed.

GEORGIA, Atlanta On 7/1/63, several restaurants which recently admitted Negroes were picketed by white persons. Pickets carried signs.

GEORGIA, Atlanta On 7/2/63, about 20 Negroes and whites picketed the Atlanta Police Dept. Protesting the arrest and beating of Rev. Ashton Bryan Jones.

GEORGIA, Savannah On 7/3/63, about 200 to 300 persons attended a rally where Hosea J. Williams spoke. Spoke at the Hi-hat Bowling Lanes.

ILLINOIS, Chicago The Chicago Board of Education was picketed on the afternoon of 7/2/63.

KANSAS, Kansas City 300 Negroes marched to the Kansas City School Board building on 7/2/63.

MARYLAND, Annapolis On 7/1/63 about nine demonstrators sat in Governor's reception room and remained in the building on 7/2/63. Want executive order on integration.

MARYLAND, Annapolis Nine demonstrators conducting sit-in at the office of Governor Tawes, were joined by 10 additional Negroes on 7/3/63.

MICHIGAN, Benton Harbor

On 7/2/63, about 500 persons, some throwing rocks and bottles roamed the streets here Tuesday and Wednesday morning protesting the arrest of two Negro youths.

MISSISSIPPI, Greenville

About 80 persons assembled in front of police station on 7/1/63, sang, prayed.

On 7/2/63, about 50 Negroes marched in the business district. Later about 50 gathered outside City Hall where the City Council was meeting. Negro was permitted to enter and appear before the council. Still later about five Negroes entered drugstore, refused to leave, and were arrested.

NEW JERSEY, Elizabeth

On 7/2/63 about 200 Negroes demonstrated at the site of new county courthouse.

NEW JERSEY, Newark

A demonstration against alleged job discrimination at a construction site turned into a brawl Wednesday 7/3/63 when some 50 construction workers crashed a line of about the same number of Negro pickets.

NORTH CAROLINA, Fayetteville

On 7/1/63, about 40 Negro high school and college students carrying placards picketed in front of five downtown department stores during the morning.

Afternoon of 7/1/63 demonstration was held in front of four restaurants, others tried to purchase theater tickets. Were refused, and 7 were arrested.

About 55 Negro high school and college students demonstrated on 7/2/63 in front of restaurants. Others attempted to purchase theater tickets. Were refused.

NORTH CAROLINA, Williamston

On 7/1/63, about 200 Negroes staged demonstration at theater.

OHIO, Dayton

CORE members demonstrated at the Rike-Kumler Co., department store on 7/1/63. They also demonstrated at a housing development on the same date.

Early afternoon on 7/1/63, about 200 Negroes demonstrated in downtown area, disregarding traffic signals and blocking traffic. 150 to 200 Negroes demonstrated during the early evening, same day. About 400 Negroes demonstrated later and ended late at night.

On 7/2/63, about 200 Negroes demonstrated in front of the Mayor's office. At 4 p.m., same day, about 200 to 300 demonstrated in the vicinity of the Mayor's office. At 6:45 p.m. about 100 Negro youths demonstrated at the police station. At 9:30 p.m., 7/2/63, Negroes arrested attempting to eat at Chow Mein Inn.

An estimated 150 Negroes demonstrated at downtown area on 7/3/63 and were arrested for obstructing traffic.

TENNESSEE, Somerville

Negroes entered several restaurants and two drugstores on 7/2/63. Service refused.

VIRGINIA, Danville

On 7/2/63, one white and 17 Negroes visited Drive-in theater, asked if integrated and departed. This was repeated at other theaters.

On 7/3/63, small groups of Negroes visited business establishments to determine whether or not they were integrated. Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth spoke to a crowd of 800, urging nonviolent fight for freedom.

WASHINGTON, Seattle

On 7/1/63, about 20 white and Negroes spent the night in the office of the Mayor. Protesting discrimination in housing.
