Dear Berl:

I take very seriously your request of April 19th for suggestions of persons to be invited to the June Conference, and I trust that you will take my recommendations equally as serious.

Frankly, I am not happy with the allocation breakdown, but since I was not able to be present at the meeting where this was discussed in detail, I must assume that I have forfeited my right to be overly critical.

Nevertheless, for the record let me say, (a) that I think it is a serious mistake to have federal government officials as official delegates; (b) that I believe the number of education people for a how-to-do conference, rather than for an analysis of the problems, is far too great; and (c) I do take some exception, also, to the number of business and industry people to be included, as well as state and local officials.

I certainly feel that no simple formula for equal numerical breakdown between the civil rights organizations would be in any way logical, since they differ so greatly in size of staff, training, constituency, purpose and geography.

As I have listened and reviewed the nature of the material to be discussed, I feel it is almost mandatory that each Urban League executive be invited. These are full-time, highly trained professionals from the strategic cities of the country. We have already provided you with a directory of our offices, but I am enclosing another.

In addition, I feel that equally important will be key and top professionals in the National Office, persons who carry


I have a partial list of names to suggest as people who ought to be invited to the Conference.







Dr. Norman attended high school in Charleston where he served as editor of the school paper, Captain of the basketball team. He was the Valedictorian of his graduating class.

He attended Howard University for a short time prior to transfer to Harvard University. He received the B.A. degree (magna cum laude) in 1950 and the M. D. degree in 1954 from Harvard. While an undergraduate in College he was president of the Harvard-Radcliffe Biological Society. He was elected a member of the Harvard University branch of Phi Beta Kappa.

Following internship and residency at Presbyterian Medical Center, New York City, Dr. Norman served as Chief Resident at Bellevue Hospital. In 1962 he held a National Institutes of Health Fellowship, studying at the University of Birmingham, England, then completing his training in cardiac surgery at the University of Michigan Medical Center in Ann Arbor.

Dr. Norman served as a Lieutenant Commander in the U. S. Navy for two years, 1957 and 1958.

He joined the Harvard Surgical Unit at the Boston City Hospital on July 1, 1964. He is Instructor in Surgery at the Harvard Medical School; Clinical Assistant in Surgery at the Boston City Hospital where he also is Chief of the Cardiac Division, Sears Surgical Laboratory.

In the Harvard Surgical Service at the Boston City Hospital, Dr. Norman initiated and coordinated a complex multi-disciplinary approach to the use of the porcine (pig) liver perfusion in the treatment of liver failure in man. Among his other interests are hyperbaric oxygenation and heart block.

4. Attorney W. Robert Ming, Jr., 123 West Madison Street, Chicago. The dean of civil rights lawyers in the Midwest; won the first case on the integration of southern state universities; formerly professor of law in the University of Chicago; head of the leading Negro law firm in Chicago.
5. Reverend Mrs. Dorothy Sutton Branch, 7918 South Parkway, Chicago, Ill.
The most active and influential woman in the civil rights movement in Chicago.
6. Alderman Claude Holman, 54 West Randolph Street, Chicago, Ill.
The leading Negro in local Democratic politics, and the closest to the Mayor.
7. Attorney Charles P. Swartz, Jr., 5135 South Woodlawn Ave., Chicago 15
One of the two or three most active white workers in civil rights.
8. Attorney Allison S. Davis, c/o The American Embassy, Bamako, Republic of Mali, West Africa, via U.S. Department of State, Washington 25, D.C. One of the younger Negro lawyers most interested in the poverty program. Founder of the Northwestern University Law School's Program on Civil Rights. Will return to Washington on annual leave in May.






Dear Berl:

We are now in the process of gathering and refining names of invitees in such a manner that we can assure all categories will be represented according to a proper geographic distribution.
