Dear Berl:

I have little to suggest in the way of people to attend the White House Conference.

*jk* I think you are alerted to the political situation in Massachusetts. Edward Brooke, a Negro, is planning to run for the Senate on the Republican ticket. His most likely opponent is Mayor John F. Collins of Boston, but former Governor Endicott Peabody is also a possibility. Lieutenant Governor Elliot Richardson has been very active in all sorts of social and civil rights activities in Massachusetts. Governor Volpe will be running for re-election, probably against former Attorney General Edward McCormack, nephew of Speaker McCormack.

My recommended solution to this snarl would be to invite Brooke because he is a prominent Negro office holder, Collins because he is the Mayor of a major city, and Volpe because he is a Governor but with the suggestion that his Lieutenant Governor would be particularly welcome if Governor Volpe can't make it.

I don't suppose, really, that all this will make a great deal of difference either in Washington or in Massachusetts, but I suppose you should consider the possible problem.

*jk* In Boston on anything to do with city planning and school districts, Ed Logue, who is the head of the Boston Redevelopment Authority, would be a very logical person to participate.

Aside from these state and local officials, I am sure that you have plenty of suggestions for educators from Massachusetts and for your other categories.

I won't make your task any more complicated by suggesting additional names.



Dear Mr. Bernhard:

You have asked us for the "full name, title and correct current address" of certain representatives of our nationwide Foundation for Freedom and Democracy in Community Life, Inc., with the intention of inviting some or all of these representatives to the forthcoming White House Conference "To Fulfill these Rights". Already on May 3, 1966, we sent you a list of the names of several of our trustees and advisory council members who are serving as chairmen of important features of our nationwide campaign to marshal the total leadership of every community for responsible voluntary action to achieve equal housing opportunities for all citizens.

We have some additional people, who are working in our Freedom of Residence program, who should certainly be invited to your Conference because each of them have done significant work and their roles are illustrative of the kind of important work that must be done by more citizens in every state of the union if we are to achieve "Equal Opportunity Neighborhoods" everywhere in our lifetime. Each of the following people would contribute a great deal to the White House Conference, especially now that President Johnson's "Freedom of Residence Legislation" proposal seems to be taking the brunt of the criticism from certain areas of Congress.


Dear Walter:
